

**Becky Naumann, M.S.P.H.**, is as an epidemiologist on the Transportation Safety Team in the National Center for Injury Prevention and Control at the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention. Ms. Naumann has a Bachelor of Science in Environmental Health degree from the University of Georgia and a Master of Science in Public Health degree from Emory University. In 2004, Ms. Naumann was awarded a U.S. Public Health Service Citation for Exemplary Performance of Duty for Sustained Quality Performance of Environmental Health and Injury Prevention Duties. In 2010, she was nominated for two CDC Honor Awards and in 2011, her study on the economic cost of motor vehicle-related injuries earned her a nomination for the CDC Charles C. Shepard award, which recognizes the best original research study published by a CDC scientist.

Her recent research has focused older adult drivers, international road traffic injury prevention, and distracted driving. Ms. Naumann has published thirteen articles, co-authored four book chapters, and has had eighteen abstracts accepted for presentation at national and international conferences.
