

Major disparities in adult cigarette smoking exist among and within racial and ethnic groups.




Past 30-day Cigarette Use among Persons 18 or Older, by Asian Sub-groups and Sex — National Survey on Drug Use and Health,

High impact media campaigns, higher prices for tobacco products, coupled with evidence-based cessation services, smoke-free policies, and promotion of cessation treatment, if fully implemented and enforced, can reduce tobacco use, particularly among racial and ethnic populations with the highest rates of use.
