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Dianna Carroll, PhD, MS, is an epidemiologist with CDC's National Center on Birth Defects and Developmental Disabilities and is a commissioned officer in the U.S. Public Health Service. She is team lead for the Disability Research and Epidemiology Team whose focus is surveillance and research of health risks and behaviors among adults with disabilities.
