**David Lowrance, MD, MPH, DTM&H** is the CDC Country Director, DGHP Director, and Acting DGHA Director in Haiti. He assumed this post in April 2014, after serving as CDC Country Director in Namibia from August 2011 where he helped lead the financial transition of the PEPFAR Namibia program and evolve CDC Namibia towards a technical assistance program. He is a medical epidemiologist who has worked for over fifteen years in global HIV/AIDS and TB. In his current role, Dr. Lowrance implements and oversees a broad array of scientific and programmatic activities related to HIV/AIDS, post-earthquake health system reconstruction, and global health protection. The portfolio in Haiti includes funding for HIV/AIDS, tuberculosis, cholera/WASH, malaria, immunization, rabies, lymphatic filariasis, and maternal and child health.

Dr. Lowrance joined CDC in 2005 as an EIS officer with the Division of Global HIV/AIDS for which he earned Peavy and Schnitker awards. Before becoming the Country Director in Namibia, Dr. Lowrance worked in Rwanda as a Medical Epidemiologist/Associate Director for Science and Technical Advisor for TB/HIV. Over the course of a career dedicated to public service, Dr. Lowrance has also worked with Medecins du Monde in Burma, as an IHS physician on the Navajo Nation, as Medical Director for Communicable Diseases on Saipan, and as a Peace Corps Volunteer in the Czech Republic.

Dr. Lowrance earned a medical degree and MPH from Tufts University, a Diploma in Tropical Medicine and Hygiene from the London School, and trained in Internal Medicine at the University of Colorado.
