**Paul T. Cantey, MD, MPH**, is a medical epidemiologist in the Division of Parasitic Diseases and Malaria, Center for Global Health. Dr. Cantey completed medical school and internal medicine residency at Emory University School of Medicine and his MPH in Epidemiology at Emory University Rollins School of Public Health. He served on the faculty at Emory School of Medicine for six years in the Division of General Medicine before coming to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention in 2007 to complete a two-year fellowship in the Epidemic Intelligence Service (EIS), where he worked in the Parasitic Diseases Branch. After EIS he worked for a year in the Immigrant, Refugee, and Migrant Health Branch before returning to the Parasitic Diseases Branch. He has been or is currently involved in epidemiologic studies or outbreak investigations involving Chagas disease, lymphatic filariasis, onchocerciasis, cryptosporidiosis, giardiasis, cyclosporiasis, and neurocysticercosis. He also provides consultation to health-care providers and public health officials on a variety of parasitic diseases.
