## Goal

The goal of this report is to provide evidence-based guidelines for reducing risks associated with animals in public settings. This is a self-paced training program designed to provide standardized recommendations for use by public health officials, veterinarians, venue operators, animal exhibitors, and others concerned with disease control, with the intent of minimizing risks associated with animals in public settings.

## Objectives

The objective of this report is to 1) describe the reasons for the development of these guidelines, 2) identify the disease risks associated with animals in public settings 3) describe populations at high risks, and 4) describe recommended prevention and control methods to reduce disease risks.
