
CDC's *Learn the Signs. Act Early.* materials help you:

- ✓ Identify infants and toddlers in need of early intervention services and preschoolers in need of special education and related services
- ✓ Raise public awareness about benefits of early intervention and preschool special education, as well as inform how to access these programs
- ✓ Provide information to support developmental screening
- ✓ Guide parents about steps to take when there is a concern about their child's development
- ✓ Support referrals and follow-up



