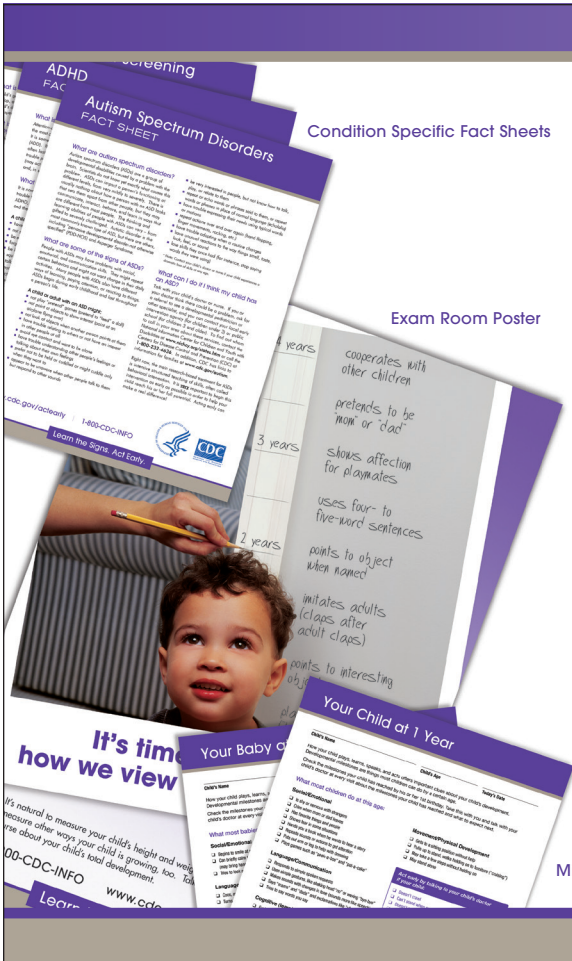
Information for health care professionals is also available, including resources from the American Academy of Pediatrics about screening, diagnosis, and coding.
