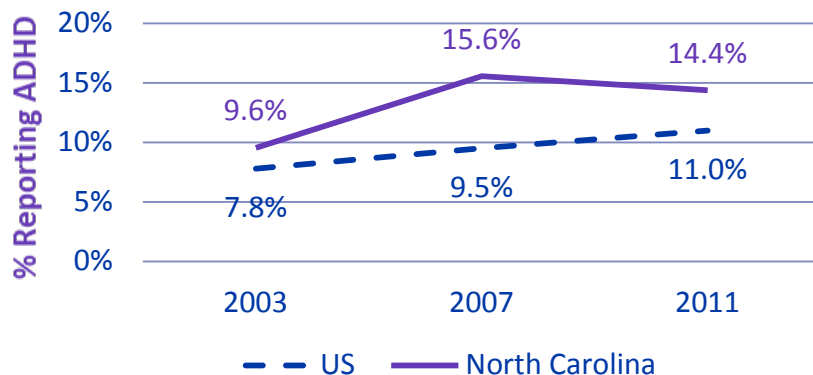

Survey Question

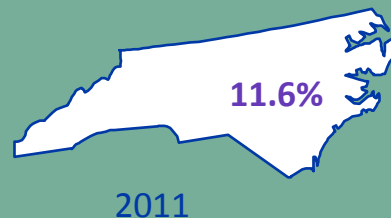
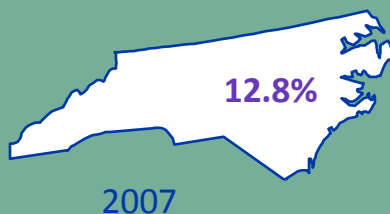
Has a doctor or health care provider **ever** told you that your child had attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder or attention deficit disorder (**ADHD or ADD**)?



Does your child **currently** have ADHD or ADD?

In 2007, 7.2% of US children and 12.8% of children in North Carolina had **current** ADHD, by parent report.

In 2011, 8.8% of US children and 11.6% of children in North Carolina had **current** ADHD, by parent report.



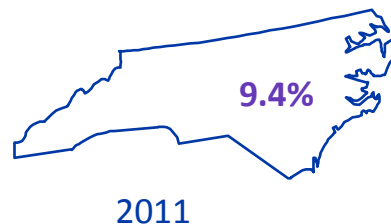
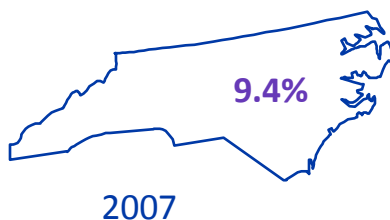
Among all US states, North Carolina ranked 1st highest.

Among all US states, North Carolina ranked 8th highest.

Is your child **currently** taking medication for ADHD or ADD?

In 2007, 4.8% of US children and 9.4% of children in North Carolina were taking medication for ADHD.

In 2011, 6.1% of US children and 9.4% of children in North Carolina were taking medication for ADHD.



Among all US states, North Carolina ranked 1st highest.

Among all US states, North Carolina ranked 5th highest.
