


## Parent-Reported Diagnosis of ADHD by a Health Care Provider and Medication Treatment Among Children 4-17 Years: National Survey of Children's Health\* – 2003 to 2011

### Survey Question



Has a doctor or health care provider **ever** told you that your child had attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder or attention deficit disorder (**ADHD or ADD**)?



Does your child **currently** have ADHD or ADD?

In 2007, 7.2% of US children and 9.7% of children in Alabama had **current** ADHD, by parent report.

In 2011, 8.8% of US children and 10.6% of children in Alabama had **current** ADHD, by parent report.





Among all US states, Alabama ranked 7<sup>th</sup> highest.

Among all US states, Alabama ranked 14<sup>th</sup> highest.

Is your child **currently** taking medication for ADHD or ADD?

In 2007, 4.8% of US children and 7.2% of children in Alabama were taking medication for ADHD.

In 2011, 6.1% of US children and 8.3% of children in Alabama were taking medication for ADHD.



Among all US states, Alabama ranked 6<sup>th</sup> highest.

Among all US states, Alabama ranked 9<sup>th</sup> highest.
