
Survey Question

Has a doctor or health care provider <u>ever</u> told you that your child had attentiondeficit/hyperactivity disorder or attention deficit disorder (ADHD or ADD)?



Does your child <u>currently</u> have ADHD or ADD?

In 2007, 7.2% of US children and 7.2% of children in New Hampshire had *current* ADHD, by parent report.



Among all US states, New Hampshire ranked 29th highest.

In 2011, 8.8% of US children and 10.1% of children in New Hampshire had *current* ADHD, by parent report.



Among all US states, New Hampshire ranked 16th highest.

Is your child <u>currently</u> taking medication for ADHD or ADD? In 2007, 4.8% of US children and 5.3% of children in New Hampshire were taking medication for ADHD.




Among all US states, New Hampshire ranked 23rd highest.

In 2011, 6.1% of US children and 6.5% of children in New Hampshire were taking medication for ADHD.



Among all US states, New Hampshire ranked 24th highest.
