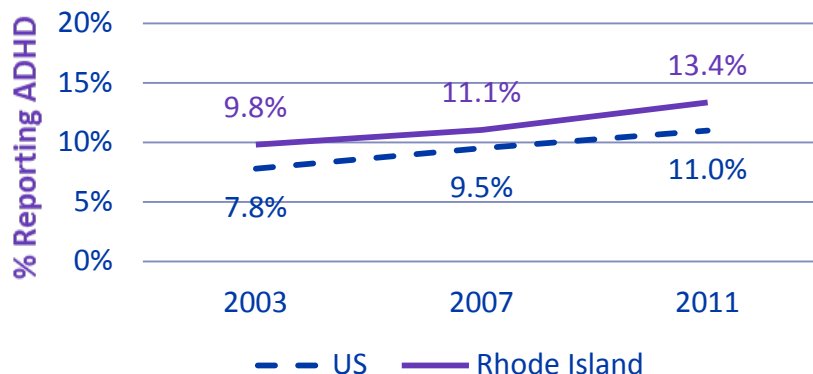


State Profile: Rhode Island

Survey Question

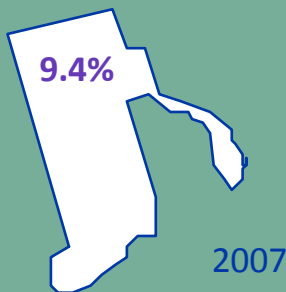
Has a doctor or health care provider ***ever*** told you that your child had attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder or attention deficit disorder (**ADHD or ADD**)?



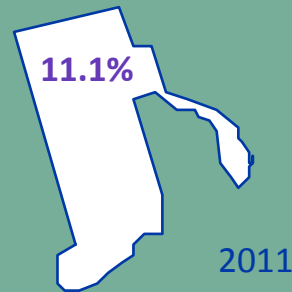
Does your child ***currently*** have ADHD or ADD?

In 2007, 7.2% of US children and 9.4% of children in Rhode Island had ***current*** ADHD, by parent report.

In 2011, 8.8% of US children and 11.1% of children in Rhode Island had ***current*** ADHD, by parent report.



Among all US states, Rhode Island ranked 10th highest.

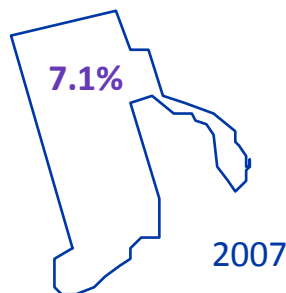


Among all US states, Rhode Island ranked 11th highest.

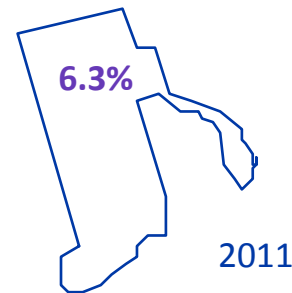
Is your child ***currently*** taking medication for ADHD or ADD?

In 2007, 4.8% of US children and 7.1% of children in Rhode Island were taking medication for ADHD.

In 2011, 6.1% of US children and 6.3% of children in Rhode Island were taking medication for ADHD.



Among all US states, Rhode Island ranked 8th highest.



Among all US states, Rhode Island ranked 28th highest.
