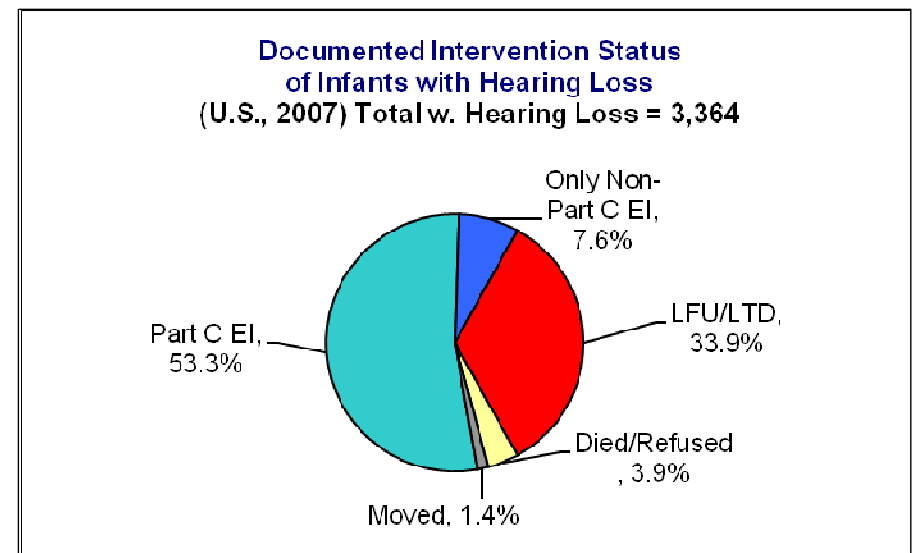
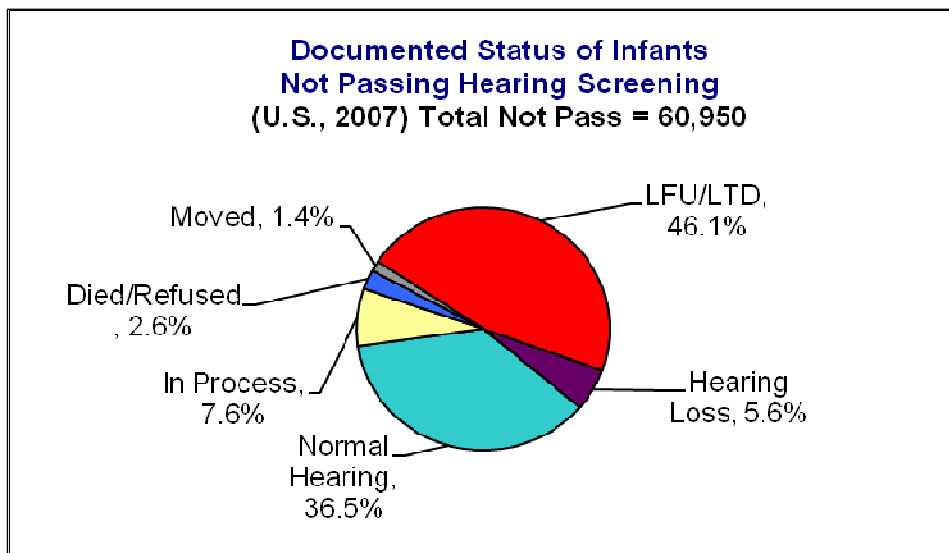
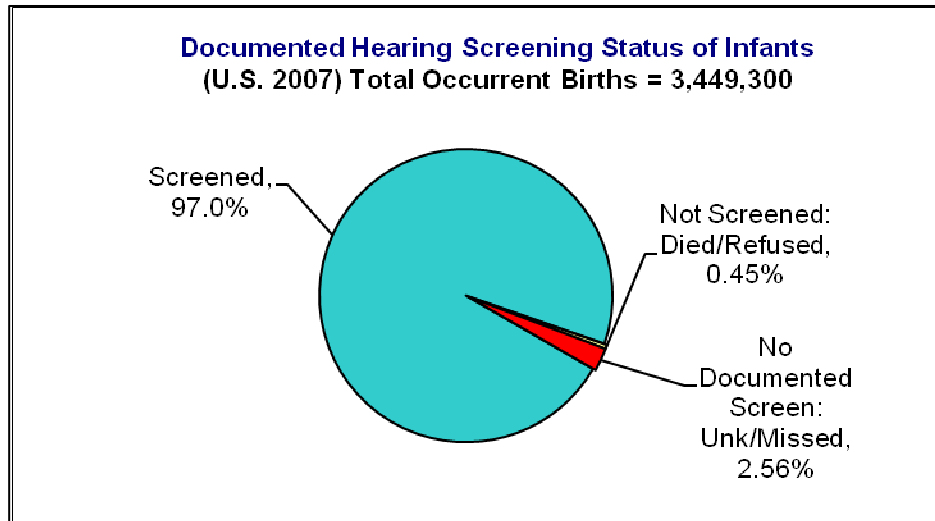

Data Notes

- HSFS Data reflects information that states and territories have reportedly **documented** without estimation. As a result, data reported by CDC EHDl may differ from other sources.
- In a small number of cases the data reported by respondents was so incomplete that it could not be included in the calculations for any of the year 2007 data items.
- Some respondents only provided partial data (e.g. hearing screening data only). As a result the number of reporting states and territories and denominators varies for some of the data sections.
- This data is subject to change if additional states and/or territories report data for year 2007.
- **In Process:** Respondents were advised that infants reported as being "In Process" must have been seen for audiologic diagnostic testing *at least one time* to be reported in this category.
- **LFU (Loss to Follow-up) / LTD (Loss to Documentation):** Sub group of "No Documented Diagnosis" and "Total No Services." Includes infants where families were *Unable to be contacted* or *Unresponsive* and *Unknown* cases.

Explanation of Calculations

Documented Hearing Screening (Based on data from 47 States & Territories)

Percent Screened:

3,345,599 (# screened) / 3,449,300 (occurrent births reported by EHDl programs) x 100 = 97.0%

Percent Screened (excluding infant deaths & parental refusals):

3,345,599 (# screened) / 3,433,777 (occurrent births excluding infant deaths & parental refusals) x 100 = 97.4%

Percent Screened (based on the # of births reported by Vital Records):

3,345,599 (# screened) / 3,489,721 (occurrent births as reported by Vital Records) x 100 = 95.9%

Percent Not Passing final / most recent hearing screening:

65,339 (# not pass) / 3,170,692 (# screened) x 100 = 2.1%

Documented Diagnosis (based on 60,950 infants not passing / data from 44 States & Territories)

Percent Normal Hearing (i.e., no diagnosed hearing loss)
