Background: El Paso Cluster

- typical cluster call

 too much MS
 environmental concern (metals smelter)
- atypical investigation – retrospective cohort
- results
 - Do we have an excess of MS?
 - How much of an excess?



SMRs

<u>1981 NINDS Survey</u> SMR = 2.80 (95% CI = 1.52 - 4.66)


<u>1989 – 1994 NHIS Surveys</u>
 SMR = 1.93 (95% CI = 1.06 – 3.24)

<u>1990 Olmsted County</u>
 SMR = 1.05 (95% CI = 0.57 - 1.76)

Conclusions and Recommendations

- two-fold increased risk of MS
- minimum disease burden in cohort (conservative estimate)
- develop current MS prevalence estimates for Texas
- re-analyze the El Paso cluster

Background : Surveillance Area

- Panhandle South Plains: 19 counties
- 17,000 square miles

- Lubbock, single metropolitan area
- eight practicing neurologists

- 420,488 people
 - 58% Anglo
 - 35% Hispanic
 - 6% African-American
- "captured" population



Pilot Results:

→ prevalence estimate 42.8 / 100,000

→ new El Paso SMR 3.42 (1.87 – 5.4)
