| <i>Escherichia coli</i> O157 |  25% decrease  | 0.98 |  | For every <i>E. coli</i> O157 case reported, there are 26 cases not diagnosed |
| <i>Listeria</i> |  No change | 0.28 |  | For every <i>Listeria</i> case reported, there are 2 cases not diagnosed |
| <i>Salmonella</i> |  No change | 16.47 |  | For every <i>Salmonella</i> case reported, there are 29 cases not diagnosed |
| <i>Vibrio</i> |  No change | 0.33 |  | For every <i>Vibrio parahaemolyticus</i> case reported, there are 142 cases not diagnosed |
| <i>Yersinia</i> |  No change | 0.34 |  | For every <i>Yersinia</i> case reported, there are 123 cases not diagnosed |
