



# HIV COMMUNICATION AMONG GAY AND BISEXUAL MEN



Many gay and bisexual men find it  
**difficult to talk about HIV**  
with their sexual partners

For gay and bisexual men, research suggests that **communication between partners** about safer sex leads to behaviors that can **help reduce risk**, like HIV testing and disclosure of HIV status



## Gay and bisexual men can help stop HIV by talking to their partners about:

**HIV STATUS**  
The first step toward  
understanding and reducing  
your risk and your partner's risk

**HIV TESTING**  
Knowing your status helps you  
take steps to protect your health  
and your partner's health

**SAFER SEX**  
Including condoms, lower risk  
sexual behaviors, and medicines  
to prevent and treat HIV
