### National Hospital Care Survey Demonstration Projects: Pneumonia Inpatient Hospitalizations and Emergency Department Visits

#### Abstract

**Objective**—This report demonstrates the use of the National Hospital Care Survey (NHCS) for the study of pneumonia inpatient hospitalizations and emergency department (ED) visits. The analysis is based on stratified data of inpatient and ED encounters from the 2014 NHCS and is intended to illustrate the capabilities of the survey, including the ability to link inpatient hospitalizations and ED visits across settings and with other data sources, case-based participation allows for nationally representative estimates.

**Methods**—For the 2014 NHCS data collection, 94 out of a sample of 513 hospitals provided separate Inpatient Brief (IB) or administrative claim data, and 83 of the 94 hospitals that provided inpatient data provided ambulatory clinician data. Analyses were conducted to study encounters with a final diagnosis of pneumonia across the inpatient and ED settings, and by residence (65–90% and 10–30% mortality). Also, case data elements such as race of the inpatient care unit (ICU) and diagnosis and physical services received were analyzed. The data are stratified and are not nationally representative.

**Results**—Analysis was conducted to estimate pneumonia encounters across inpatient and ED settings, and they highlight the analytical capabilities of NHCS not available in previous surveys. Most pneumonia inpatient hospitalizations were for those aged 65 and over, while in the ED, more pneumonia visits were for those under age 65 years. For inpatient, ICU stays increased the overall time spent in the hospital by 50%, from 4.3 to 7.3 days. In addition, the average age of those who died within 30 days after discharge was 77.

#### Introduction

Pneumonia is a lung infection that can be caused by bacteria, viruses, or fungi (1,2). The symptoms of pneumonia

range from mild to severe, and serious symptoms include cough with phlegm ("wet cough"), difficulty breathing, fever, chest pain, fatigue, and confusion (2). In 2016, the National Hospital Discharge

Survey (NHDS) reported 2.1 million (2.2%) inpatient hospitalizations for pneumonia in the United States, and the National Hospital Ambulatory Medical Care Survey (NHAMCS) estimated 1.5 million emergency department (ED) visits (1.7%) for pneumonia in 2014. There were about 50,000 deaths caused by pneumonia in the United States in 2014 (3).

Although pneumonia is not a leading cause of death for those aged 65 and over, an observational study of a subset of Medicare patients showed that the mortality rate for those aged 80 and over with pneumonia (15.4%) were double that of those aged 65–69 (7.8%) (4). Pneumonia is one of the conditions listed as a potentially avoidable inpatient hospitalization, which is defined as a condition that could have been prevented or treated outside of the inpatient setting (5).

The National Hospital Care Survey (NHCS) provides unique opportunities to study how pneumonia is diagnosed and treated across the continuum of care for pneumonia patients in U.S. hospitals. Patient identifiers allow for the study of 90-, 60-, and 30-day mortality among hospital discharges and ED visits, while collections of services received (such as use of the intensive care unit (ICU) and diagnostic services) allows for analysis of hospital settings. ## Characteristics of Office-based Physician Visits, 2015

#### Key findings

##### Data from the National Ambulatory Medical Care Survey

• In 2015, there were an estimated 313 office-based physician visits per 100 persons.

• The visit rate among females exceeded the rate for males, and the rates for both infants and older adults exceeded the rates for those aged 1–64 years.

• Private insurance was the primary expected source of payment for the majority of visits by children under age 18 and adults aged 18–64, whereas Medicare was the primary expected source of payment for the majority of visits by adults aged 65 and over.

• Compared with adults, a larger percentage of visits by children were for either preventive care or a new problem.

• Compared with children, a larger percentage of visits by adults included a laboratory test, imaging service, or procedure that was ordered or provided.

In 2015, most Americans had a usual place to receive health care (85% of adults and 90% of children) (1,2). The majority of children and adults listed a doctor's office as the usual place they received care (1,2). In 2015, there were an estimated 313 office-based physician visits in the United States (3,4). This report examines visit rates by age and sex. It also examines visit characteristics—including insurance status, reason for visit, and services—by age. Estimates use data from the 2015 National Ambulatory Medical Care Survey (NAMCS).

Figure 1. Visit rates, by selected demographics, United States, 2015




Figure 1. Visit rates, by selected demographics, United States, 2015. Rates are based on a nationally representative sample of 1,111 offices in 2015. Rates are based on the July 1, 2015, population of the United States (estimated population of the United States, as reported in the National Hospital Discharge Survey, 2016, annual report, by race and ethnicity, age, sex, and Hispanic or Latino ethnicity. <https://www.hhs.gov/ncchs/nchs-data-reports-and-publications/national-hospital-discharge-survey-2016-annual-report>). Rates are based on the July 1, 2015, population of the United States (estimated population of the United States, as reported in the National Hospital Discharge Survey, 2016, annual report, by race and ethnicity, age, sex, and Hispanic or Latino ethnicity. <https://www.hhs.gov/ncchs/nchs-data-reports-and-publications/national-hospital-discharge-survey-2016-annual-report>).

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



### National Health Care Surveys Registration
