The National Health and Nutrition Examination Survey (NHANES) is being conducted in your area by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC). The American Academy of Pediatrics (AAP), an organization of 60,000 pediatricians dedicated to the health and well-being of all infants, children, adolescents and young adults, supports this major national survey.
