- 1. Describe the scope of the problem of infections among hemodialysis patients.
- 2. Define key terms, Dialysis Event definitions and protocols used in data collection and reporting Dialysis Events.
- 3. Describe how to collect event data using Dialysis Event form.
- 4. Explain how Dialysis event rates are calculated and reported to promote performance improvement.
