Gaylon:

I've done a quick review of the Worker Family Protection report to Congress.

I compared the current report to my notes from the Worker Family Protection Task Force meeting and the Task Force's suggestions. Given NIOSH's desire to get this out pronto, I will only address those comments that are of a higher priority. (I had hoped that more of the Task Force's comments would be included, but that's history at this point.)

1. Page 58, last sentence before the bullets: The Task Force raised the issue that this sentence reads as though these are NIOSH recommendations, when in fact they are merely what the Ag Extension offices say. A Task Force member suggested replacing the sentence with something like "The following methods have been identified in the literature to address this issue:"

I will defer to Marilyn on this comment as this is really a matter of NIOSH policy.

2. Page 71 (Chapter 6) 1st paragraph: Delete the following sentences:
"This review demonstrates that , with rare exception, both Federal and State laws have not been drafted to protect family members directly from workers' home contamination; if prevention of take-home contamination is a
