

Radiation Exposure Compensation Act



In 1990, Congress passed the **Radiation Exposure Compensation Act (RECA)**. It compensates eligible uranium miners, millers, and ore transporters (or their families) in the amount of \$100,000, who developed certain diseases following their employment. To be eligible for compensation, the uranium worker must have developed one of these specified diseases: *lung cancer; fibrosis of the lung; pulmonary fibrosis; cor pulmonale related to fibrosis of the lung; silicosis; pneumoconiosis*; and in the case of millers and ore transporters, *renal cancer or chronic renal disease*.
