There were more than **750,000** law enforcement officers in 2012.¹



Officers spend **many hours** behind the wheel and face increased risk when responding to emergency calls.



564 officers died due to vehicle crashes, **31%** of all line-of-duty deaths from 2005-2016.²



Of the **152** fatal crashes from 2012-2016, almost half were single-vehicle events.²

Officers can prevent crashes and injuries when they:

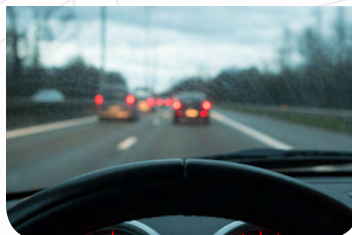
