2022 Monkeypox Outbreak

Monkeypox Response Update: Vaccine Strategy

- On August 9 FDA Authorizes Emergency Use of JYNNEOS Vaccine to Increase Vaccine Supply | FDA)
- Authorizes both intradermal and subcutaneous JYNNEOS administration
- For intradermal administration, each single dose vial can be used to obtain up to five 0.1 mL doses with appropriate needle for adults 18 years or older administration

Monkeypox Response Update: PREP Act Coverage

- Public Readiness and Emergency Preparedness (PREP) Act declaration for smallpox Countermeasures includes orthopox viruses, e.g., monkeypox
 - See <u>www.federalregister.gov/documents/2015/12/09/2015-31092/smallpox-</u> medical-countermeasures-amendment
- PREP Act declaration was issued in 2008, amended in 2016, and remains in effect
 - Qualified providers under PREP Act declaration are covered when they administer monkeypox vaccine as required under either the license or the <u>emergency use authorization</u> issued August 9, which includes intradermal and subcutaneous administration


PHEP BP4 ORR Implementation

Budget Period 3 (BP3) ORR Feedback

- PORTS user survey on BP3 ORR implementation process, training, and guidance now available
- CDC encourages users to provide feedback on how to improve ORR process going forward
- Survey closes 11:59 p.m. EDT on Friday, September 16

PHEP Operational Readiness Review (ORR)

- Assesses all-hazards readiness across 15 CDC public health emergency preparedness and response capabilities
- Rigorous evaluation informed by more than 100 CDC and field-based subject matter experts
 - Documents gaps, strengths, and promising practices
 - Identifies opportunities for CDC technical assistance



PHEP ORR Methods

- PHEP recipients required to submit data to meet PHEP requirements
 - Recipients respond to ORR evaluation questions and provide supplemental evidence to support submitted data
 - DSLR project officers, in consultation with evaluation staff, objectively review evidence to substantiate recipient responses
- Continuous review cycle facilitates quality improvements and timely reporting

Modified ORR in BP3 to Assess COVID-19 Response

- Pandemic COVID-19 Functional Exercise: Vaccination for Critical Workforce Groups and Disproportionately Impacted Populations (VAC)
- Pandemic COVID-19 Incident Response (RSP)
- Partner-focused measures that support health equity
 - Annual PHEP Exercise with Access and Functional Needs Partners
 - Joint Functional Exercise with Emergency Management and Health Care Coalitions
- October 31, 2022: Deadline to submit additional supporting evidence

BP4 ORR Strategy

- PHEP ORR will focus on collecting essential data related to select capability planning elements
- Local Cities Readiness Initiative planning jurisdictions will not be required to submit data in Budget Period 4

BP4 ORR Reporting Requirements

- ~50 data elements versus approximately 200 elements in full PHEP ORR
- Elements align with operational data reported in BP3, primarily RSP elements
- Related ORR guidance is found in Section 2: Evaluation of Plans
- ORR forms expected to be available for data input in November 2022
 - See pages 20-95
 - Contains elements from each of the capabilities
- ORR forms expected to be available for data input in November 2022
