CDC Changes Travel Health Notices from Global Level 3 to Destination Specific Notices

Travel Health Notices (THN) inform travelers and clinicians about current health issues that impact travelers' health, like disease outbreaks, special events or gatherings, and natural disasters, in specific international destinations. In March 2020, CDC issued a global Level 3 THN. CDC has changed from a global Level 3 THN to destination specific notices. As the COVID-19 situation around the world changes, CDC is monitoring COVID-19 risk in each destination and making travel recommendations. CDC Offers RealOpt© Training on Vaccination Planning and POD Sites on Sept 14

The next CDC virtual instructor-led RealOpt© training session on vaccination and point-of-dispensing (POD) sites will be held on **Monday, Sept. 14.** Participants will learn the basic components of RealOpt©, a computer modeling program that determines POD or vaccination site staff requirements and examines process efficiencies based on site-specific configurations. With this tool, participants will learn to manipulate existing POD and vaccine flow models and how to run and interpret the performance reports. By the end of the session, participants will have learned how to build or modify their own models to identify where staff should be allocated and how to eliminate bottlenecks and optimize processing times. Registration for the RealOpt© training session is completed through <u>CDC TRAIN</u>. The training registration deadline is **seven days** prior to the course delivery date. Additional training sessions will be held on:

CDC encourages POD and vaccination managers, local and state medical countermeasure planners, and other preparedness planners to register for the monthly training session.



CDC Hosts Webinar Series on Equity and Policy Preparedness during Public Health Emergencies

CDC's Center for Preparedness and Response and Center for State, Tribal, Local, and Territorial Support, in partnership with the National Governor's Association, and the American Bar Association will host a four-part legal preparedness series titled "Equity and Policy Preparedness during Public Health Emergencies." Kicking off in September to mark National Preparedness Month, the series is intended for public health professionals, state and territorial health officials, and public health lawyers.

- September 17: Equity in Encouraging and Enforcing Mitigation Measures
- October 22: Equitable Distribution and Uptake of Remedies and Resources
- November 19: People Experiencing Homelessness
- December 17: People Who Are Incarcerated

Strategic National Stockpile Temporarily Suspends RSS Site Validation Process

Due to the evolving COVID-19 pandemic and response operations, the Strategic National Stockpile (SNS), managed by the HHS Office of the Assistant Secretary for Preparedness and Response, has temporarily suspended all receipt, stage, and store (RSS) validations until further notice. CDC Announces New LEEP Online Training Program

CDC's Public Health Law Program, within the Center for State, Tribal, Local, and Territorial Support (CSTLTS) has developed a Law and Epidemic Preparedness (LEEP) online training program. LEEP is a free, self-paced, e-learning course that helps improve understanding of the use of law during a large-scale communicable disease response. The training covers the legal underpinnings of emergency preparedness and response systems, what actions are authorized, and how to minimize legal barriers to an effective large-scale communicable disease response.
