PHEP BP3 Continuation Guidance Scheduled to Be Released Today

CDC has finalized the PHEP Budget Period 3 (BP3) continuation guidance, which will be available to recipients today, January 15, in the Grants Management Module (GMM) in GrantSolutions. Preparedness directors will also receive a copy of the guidance today via the State and Local Readiness mailbox. CDC will conduct an informational call with recipients from **3:30 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. EST on Thursday, January 21**, to provide an overview of the guidance and answer questions (see call details below). The deadline to submit funding applications is Tuesday, March 16.

As previously announced, the BP3 funding table in the guidance will include preliminary planning numbers consistent with Budget Period 2 funding. **CDC will update the recipient funding amounts to reflect the FY 2021 increase in PHEP funding.** The PHEP BP3 Notices of Award issued at the end of June will reflect final BP3 funding amounts.

COVID-19 Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement Information Due Today, January 15 Today, January 15, is the deadline to submit requests for no-cost extensions and Quarter 3 fiscal and progress reports for CDC's COVID-19 Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement funding.

No-Cost Extension Requests

The period of performance for the CDC COVID-19 Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement expires on March 15, 2021. CDC recognizes that funded jurisdictions may not be able to complete all of their approved activities by that date. Recipients that need more time to complete their approved activities can request up to an additional 12 months to do so. Since not all jurisdictions will likely need the full 12 months to complete the work and expend the funds, jurisdictions may request a time frame that is appropriate for their situation. Activities must be completed no later than March 15, 2022.

Recipients must submit no-cost extension requests by **today**, **January 15** via the Grants Management Module in GrantSolutions using the management amendment type for no-cost extensions. Jurisdictions may include budget adjustments as needed; no separate budget amendment is required. CDC will review requests and provide responses as quickly as possible after receipt. Quarter 3 Reports

Recipients must submit their December fiscal reports and third quarterly progress reports for the COVID-19 Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement by **today**, **January 15** in REDCap. For the third quarterly progress report, recipients should provide programmatic updates on their response activities from October 1 to December 31, focusing on successes and challenges to date. The December fiscal report should summarize obligations and commitments incurred through December 31. In addition to the required reports, recipients can complete and submit the "TA and Unfunded Needs" form in REDCap to identify technical assistance needs and requirements for which they may not have sufficient funding under the current award.

CDC Adds New Vaccine Data to COVID Data Tracker

CDC has published new data on COVID-19 vaccination efforts in the United States, expanding the information reported on the <u>CDC COVID Data Tracker</u> to include:

- Total number of doses administered,
- Number of people receiving one or more doses of COVID-19 vaccine,
- Number of people receiving two doses of COVID-19 vaccine, and
- Breakdown of overall vaccine administration by manufacturer.

The vaccinations page on the CDC COVID Data Tracker is designed to provide a national overview of data about vaccine distribution and administration, and these updates are part of ongoing efforts by CDC to share timely and accurate information. However, it is important to note that the information presented in the data tracker may not match the number of doses delivered and administered by jurisdictions. This could be due to several factors, including:

- Timing of the data delivery,
- Technical difficulties related to processing or transmission of the data, and
- The review and reconciliation process needed to incorporate data from multiple sources by CDC.

CDC will continue to work to provide COVID-19 vaccination data as quickly and accurately as possible. Ongoing monitoring of the data is critical to informing and implementing the national COVID-19 vaccination program.
