#### **PHEP ORR Training Resources Now Available**

CDC is conducting a series of PHEP Connects webinars designed to orient PHEP recipients to CDC's PHEP Operational Readiness Review (ORR) interim guidance, including new concepts and terminology. These sessions are intended to help prepare PHEP recipients to successfully complete an ORR over the course of Budget Period 3 (BP3). The first session was held on April 21, with CDC presenter Christopher Reinold providing an overview of the <a href="PHEP ORR interim guidance">PHEP ORR interim guidance</a> and BP3 data submission requirements. The <a href="presentation slides">presentation slides</a> and the <a href="BP3 implementation fact sheet">BP3 implementation fact sheet</a> are available on the <a href="CDC website">CDC website</a>. CDC expects to post the schedule for the remaining webinars in early May.

CDC has adapted its PHEP ORR implementation for BP3, streamlining requirements for recipients due to COVID-19 response activities. Data collection will be significantly reduced to include previously reported descriptive data such as critical contact sheets; PHEP benchmark data, primarily related to laboratory testing; and select new operational elements. In addition, recipients will be able to use COVID-19 response activities to demonstrate operational elements and meet requirements, where fitting. CDC also plans to temporarily suspend state evaluation of Cities Readiness Initiative (CRI) local planning jurisdictions. This includes waiving the new requirement for CRI jurisdictions to complete the annual PHEP exercise incorporating access and functional needs partners in BP3. CRI jurisdictions instead can use BP3 to plan for implementing and reporting this exercise in Budget Period 4.

CDC encourages PHEP recipients and local jurisdictions to attend these orientation sessions. In addition to the training sessions, CDC is developing written materials, including responses to frequently asked questions, to help recipients prepare for the PHEP ORR implementation. PHEP project officers also will provide continuous individual technical assistance throughout BP3.



### **CDC Seeks Updated SF-424 Information**

Today, **Friday**, **April 23**, is the deadline for Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement (CDC-RFA-TP18-1802) recipients to submit updated SF-424 applications for federal assistance. This short form provides basic information necessary to issue federal funding during an emergency. The current 65 approved but unfunded jurisdictions remain eligible for funding through January 2022. Since the applications on file were submitted in 2018, CDC is requesting that the jurisdictions submit updated information. The fillable SF-424 is available on grants.gov at SF-424 Family | GRANTS.GOV and also available as a grant note in GrantSolutions. Based on the questions received, CDC is providing this additional guidance and clarification. This SF-424 is not tied to any specific funding or previous awards. This is an addendum to applications submitted in 2018 to ensure CDC has the most current information.

#### CDC COVID-19 Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement Quarterly Reports Due

Progress updates for the fourth quarter (Q4) of COVID-19 Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement awards were due April 15. The Q4 updates are **required** for all recipients, regardless of whether they are closing out their awards or have received no-cost extensions. Recipients who have not provided updates on their Q4 activities should do so immediately in the REDCap reporting system. # **CDC Highlights Resources to Support COVID-19 Vaccination Efforts**

To support equitable vaccine uptake in communities disproportionately affected by COVID-19, CDC's <u>National Center for Immunization and Respiratory Diseases</u> recently released multiple resources to support jurisdictions and community-based organizations with COVID-19 vaccination efforts.

- The <u>Guide for Developing, Implementing, and Monitoring Community-Driven Strategies</u> is designed to support the 64 state and local health department recipients in using \$3 billion in funding for communitydriven approaches to develop, implement, and monitor` strategies to increase equitable vaccine uptake among racial and ethnic minority groups.
- Building on that effort, CDC has created a complementary resource specific to community-based organizations, the <u>Guide for Community Partners</u>. This guide can help organizations with community-level reach with racial and ethnic minority groups or other under-resourced communities get connected to COVID-19 vaccination confidence and access efforts and resources.
   A short two-page version of the community guide, <u>COVID-19 Vaccine Equity: Best Practices for Community and Faith-Based Organizations</u>, provides an overview of strategies and interventions detailed in the guide.
- To sustain the focus on equitable vaccine uptake and address vaccine hesitancy, CDC released the <u>Guide for Jurisdictions to Expand COVID-19 Vaccine Distribution to Primary Care Providers</u>. This guide outlines a data-driven approach that jurisdictions can use to increase vaccination opportunities provided by primary care providers and medical offices, especially in communities that are socially marginalized. In addition to the Guide, CDC will provide jurisdictions with data analyses and technical assistance to support increased vaccine distribution to and expanded enrollment of medical offices located in census tracts with high Social Vulnerability Index (SVI) scores.

# **NEMA Conducts Workshop on Developing Mission Ready Packages**

The National Emergency Management Association (NEMA) will host a series of workshops on developing mission ready packages (MRPs). MRPs are specific response or recovery capabilities that have been created to ensure the skills, capabilities and associated costs are bundled prior to an emergency or disaster for more efficient deployment. MRPs are based on National Incident Management System (NIMS) resource typing

concepts but also identify specific details about the resource such as mission description and capability, estimated mission costs, resource footprint, limiting factors, and logistical support requirements. MPRs can greatly assist with the effective and timely deployment of mutual aid assets.

These workshop sessions are designed for resource providers. A resource provider is any organization able to deploy under the <a href="Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC)">Emergency Management Assistance Compact (EMAC)</a> and has capabilities that might be needed during an emergency response.
