August 11 PHEP Connects Webinar Highlights California's COVID-19 Responder Safety and Health Program

CDC's next PHEP Connects webinar is scheduled for **1 p.m. EDT on Wednesday, August 11**. This webinar will detail the experiences of the



California Department of Public Health (CDPH) while implementing a responder safety and health program to protect its staff during the COVID-19 response. CDPH presenters Armando Chevez, Danny Kwon, and Svetlana Smorodinsky will describe their approach for identifying responder safety and health gaps and implementing the Emergency Responder Health Monitoring and Surveillance (ERHMS) framework into CDPH's incident management structure. Presenters will also discuss coordinating across centers to improve responder safety protocols and lessons they learned in rostering, tracking, and monitoring deployed staff. CDC Provides Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement Response Funding Resources

CDC has released two resources for recipients of CDC's Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement COVID-19 supplemental funding. The <u>frequently asked questions (FAQs)</u> document summarizes CDC responses to a variety of questions related to the \$2 billion in funding that CDC awarded to support COVID-19 workforce development in 65 jurisdictions. In addition, CDC has developed <u>general quidance</u> on using federal funds to provide incentives to support COVID-19 testing and vaccination. Both documents can be found on the CDC website.

CDC Updates Guidance for Fully Vaccinated People

On July 27, CDC updated its <u>Interim Public Health Recommendations for Fully Vaccinated People</u> and <u>When</u> <u>You've Been Fully Vaccinated</u> web pages based on new evidence on the B.1.617.2 (Delta) variant currently circulating in the United States. The updated web page adds recommendations that fully vaccinated people take the following precautions.

- Wear a mask in public indoor settings in areas of substantial or high transmission,
- Mask to protect those who are at increased risk for severe disease from COVID-19, and
- Be tested and mask if they have had close contact with a suspected or confirmed case of COVID-19.

Also, in this update, CDC recommends universal indoor masking in all K-12 school settings for teachers, staff, students, and visitors, regardless of vaccination status or location.

CDC's July 27 <u>Science Brief: Background Rationale and Evidence for Public Health Recommendations for</u> <u>Fully Vaccinated People</u> added data from recent studies that demonstrate currently authorized mRNA vaccines provide high efficacy against COVID-19 severe enough to require hospitalization and death.

CDC has also issued a Health Alert Network Health Advisory, "Vaccination to Prevent COVID-19 Outbreaks with Current and Emergent Variants," to notify public health practitioners and clinicians about the urgent need to increase COVID-19 vaccination coverage (i.e., the percentage of the population fully vaccinated) across the United States to prevent surges in new infections. New Minority Health Social Vulnerability Index Now Available

CDC and the Office of Minority Health at the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) have developed the <u>Minority Health Social Vulnerability Index (SVI)</u>. The new tool is intended to enhance existing resources to support the identification of racial and ethnic minority communities at the greatest risk for disproportionate impact and adverse outcomes due to the COVID-19 pandemic. The Minority Health SVI is an extension of the CDC Social Vulnerability Index, which is a platform that helps emergency response planners and public health officials identify, map, and plan support for communities that will most likely need support before, during, and after a public health emergency.

Surgeon General Addresses Health Misinformation

Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy has released <u>Confronting Health Misinformation: The U.S. Surgeon</u> <u>General's Advisory on Building a Healthy Information Environment</u>. This document is intended to limit the prevalence and impact of misinformation to help individuals make more informed decisions about their personal health and the health of their loved ones and communities.

CDC Offers August 9 RealOpt© Vaccination and POD Training

The next CDC virtual instructor-led RealOpt© training session on vaccination and point-of-dispensing (POD) sites will be held on **Monday, August 9**. Participants will learn the basic components of RealOpt©, a computer modeling program that determines POD or vaccination site staff requirements and examines process efficiencies based on site-specific configurations. With this tool, participants will learn to manipulate existing POD and vaccine flow models and how to run and interpret the performance reports. By the end of the session, participants will have learned how to build or modify their own models to identify where staff should be allocated and how to eliminate bottlenecks and optimize processing times.

CDC encourages POD and vaccination managers, local and state medical countermeasure planners, and other preparedness planners to register for the training session. Registration for the RealOpt© training session is completed through <u>CDC TRAIN</u>. Please note the training registration deadline is **seven days** prior to the course delivery date. An additional training session will be held on **Thursday**, **September 16**.
