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PHEP Cooperative Agreement Updates

PHEP BP4 Continuation Guidance to Be Released January 14

CDC's Office of Grants Services (OGS) anticipates releasing the PHEP Budget Period 4 (BP4) continuation guidance and application kits today, January 14, in GrantSolutions. Recipients will receive an email with a link to the documents when they are available. The application deadline is **Monday, March 21**.

CDC will hold an informational call at **2 p.m. EST on Thursday**, **January 20**, to orient PHEP recipients to the BP4 continuation guidance and application requirements. In addition, the PERFORMS training team will conduct two training sessions on the PHEP BP4 application module at **1 p.m. EST on Tuesday**, **January 25**, **and 11 a.m. EST on Wednesday**, **January 26**. Both sessions will cover the same information and users may participate in either or both sessions. CDC will also conduct separate calls for Pacific island recipients and will provide that information separately.

PHEP ORR Friday Feature: Submitting a DSLR PORTS Application Form

In anticipation of the launch of the PHEP ORR Reporting and Tracking System (PORTS) in March, this week's PHEP ORR



Friday Feature orients recipients on how to gain access to the system. Only the 62 PHEP recipients will have access to PORTS initially, as CDC has temporarily suspended evaluation of local Cities Readiness Initiative (CRI) jurisdictions. As a result, only staff from the 62 PHEP jurisdictions will need to request PORTS access for Budget Period 3 (BP3).

There is no limit on the number of users per jurisdiction. CDC encourages every PHEP director to request access to PORTS, as they will need to review information in PORTS before it can be submitted to CDC. However, once enrolled and onboarded, PHEP directors may designate a proxy for approval responsibilities if those proxies have also been enrolled and onboarded. Preparedness directors or their designees must submit all PORTS application forms for new users to their PHEP project officers. CDC expects to have the PORTS application form available on the CDC website the week of January 17 and will notify recipients when it is posted.

Following are the PORTS application steps.

- 1. Prospective PORTS users download the form from the CDC website or request the form from their PHEP project officers.
- Each prospective PORTS user completes an application form, providing brief information such as name, email address, jurisdiction, and user role. The roles include data entry, submit for review, state reviewer, read only, and user manager. Prospective users must also indicate whether they have a CDC Secure Access and Management Services (SAMS) account, which is required for PORTS access.
- 3. Prospective users either submit the completed application to an approving official or, if already an approving official, submit it to their PHEP project officers. Approving officials are preparedness directors or their designees.
- 4. PHEP project officers review applications to validate the appropriate user roles and submit the forms to the DSLR information technology team on behalf of the users for processing.
- 5. Project officers notify the preparedness directors within five business days if their forms cannot be submitted and how to address any identified issues.
- 6. Prospective PORTS users with SAMS accounts receive a notification from SAMS when the PORTS registration process has been completed. If they do not have a SAMS account, prospective users receive instructions from SAMS on how to register for a SAMS account.

As the onboarding of PORTS users is a continual process, there is no deadline for submitting applications. However, CDC encourages PHEP recipients to submit their user application forms as soon as possible, so they can access PORTS when it opens in March. White House Releases Fact Sheet on Increasing COVID-19 Testing in Schools

On January 12, the White House released a <u>fact sheet</u> on increasing COVID-19 tests in K-12 schools by 10 million per month to keep students safe and schools open. Five million of these tests will be rapid tests to help K-12 schools stay open and to implement and sustain screening testing and test-to stay programs. The remaining 5 million will be lab-based PCR tests to help schools to perform individual and pooled testing in classrooms nationwide.

Operation Expanded Testing Webpage Now Available

CDC's Operation Expanded Testing (OpET) program has created <u>a new webpage</u> to share expanded testing resources and information. OpET provides no-cost testing to childcare centers, K-12 schools, historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs), under-resourced communities, and congregate settings, such as homeless shelters, domestic violence and abuse shelters, non-federal correctional facilities, and other qualified sites. The OpET program is available through July 1, 2022. The contractor-provided laboratory services include specimen collection supplies, shipping materials, laboratory testing, and results reporting. Facilities interested in OpET's no-cost <u>screening testing</u> program can use <u>this webpage</u> to enroll.

Crisis Response Workforce Development Funding Reports Due January 21

The first COVID-19 Public Health Workforce Supplemental Funding fiscal and progress reports are due **Friday**, **January 21**. Recipients should submit status updates in REDCap on fiscal commitments made during the previous six months, as well as status updates on meeting hiring goals and diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) metrics.
