

PHEP Cooperative Agreement Updates

PFA Host Site Applications Due Today, February 24

Today, February 24, is the deadline to submit applications to host Preparedness Field Assignees (PFAs). PHEP jurisdictions that are interested in hosting PFAs must submit PFA host site <u>applications</u> to <u>dslrpfa@cdc.gov</u> by **11:59 p.m. EST today, Friday, February 24**. CDC is expanding the current PFA program to meet the growing preparedness and response workforce needs of PHEP jurisdictions. DSLR encourages PHEP jurisdictions that currently **do not** host PFAs to consider doing so. CDC funds the salaries of PFAs to develop their skills and field experience while at the same time helping to augment jurisdictions' preparedness and response capacity. Crisis Response COVID-19 Supplemental Funding No-cost Extension Requests Due March 2

Next Thursday, **March 2**, is the deadline to submit no-cost extension requests for the COVID-19 supplemental funding awards issued in 2020 and in 2021 through the Public Health Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement. Recipients who need additional time to complete activities for either of these awards must submit no-cost extension requests to CDC via GrantSolutions no later than **Thursday, March 2**. Recipients should contact their CDC project officers for assistance in submitting these requests.

Updated Mpox Funding Work Plans and Budgets Due March 6

At the end of January, CDC awarded approximately \$33.7 million in mpox funding to 52 jurisdictions through the Public Health Crisis Response Cooperative Agreement. This funding is intended to assist jurisdictions in responding to remaining cases of mpox, prevent future outbreaks by increasing vaccine accessibility, demand, and uptake among recommended populations, and to strengthen capabilities to prepare for, and respond to the potential reintroduction of mpox cases.

Updated budget narratives and work plans are due in REDCap and GrantSolutions no later than **Monday**, **March 6**. Recipients should prioritize work plan activities that address their most urgent public health needs within the first year of the performance period. As these funds are provided as part of a public health crisis response, CDC strongly recommends recipients begin using funds and implementing activities as soon as possible. Specifically, in anticipation of upcoming social events this spring and summer, it is critically important to provide access to vaccines at low to no cost and to vaccinate those most in need.

February 28 COCA Call Highlights Drug-Resistant Shigellosis

CDC will conduct a Clinician Outreach and Communication Activity (COCA) call from **2 p.m. to 3 p.m. EST on Tuesday, February 28**. CDC has detected an increase in <u>extensively drug-resistant (XDR) Shigella infections</u> (shigellosis) reported through national surveillance systems. During the call, subject matter experts from CDC, the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment, and the United Kingdom Health Security Agency will provide updates on the current domestic and global epidemiology of XDR shigellosis, discuss its relevance for clinicians in the United States, describe infection presentation, explain the importance of having a detailed sexual and travel history, share approaches for clinical management, and review how clinicians should test and report shigellosis.

Materials for the call will be available on the <u>COCA Call webpage</u> in the call materials section. The presentation slides will be available the day of the call, and the call recording will be posted a few hours after the live event ends. Continuing Education (CE) credits will be offered for this COCA Call.

Health Affairs Journal Hosts March 8 Briefing on Public Health during COVID-19

On March 6, the Health Affairs journal will publish several research papers focused on lessons for public health policy and practice arising from the COVID-19 pandemic experience in the United States. In conjunction with the publication, Health Affairs will host a virtual briefing, "Public Health during COVID-19," from **1 p.m. to 4 p.m. EST on Wednesday, March 8**. During the briefing, the authors will discuss their research and the broad lessons from COVID-19 for the future of public health. Speakers include Beth L. Rubenstein, a CDC Career Epidemiology Field Officer (CEFO) assigned to the New York City (NYC) Department of Health and Mental Hygiene. She will discuss the findings of a study she led regarding COVID-19 vaccination rate increases among NYC municipal employees after implementation of vaccination requirements. NACCHO to Host March 21 Webinar on Preventive Services and Pandemic Lessons Learned The National Association of County and City Health Officials (NACCHO) and the HHS <u>Office of Disease</u> <u>Prevention and Health Promotion</u> (ODPHP) will host a webinar from 2 p.m. to 3 p.m. EST on Tuesday, March 21, on "The Importance of Preventive Services and Lessons Learned from the Pandemic." Part of the Healthy People 2030 webinar series, the March 21 presentation will focus on preventive services and highlight progress to date on three Healthy People 2030 objectives:

- <u>IID-09</u>: Increase the proportion of persons who are vaccinated annually against seasonal influenza (Leading Health Indicator)
- MICH-08: Increase the proportion of pregnant women who receive early and adequate prenatal care
- <u>STI-04</u>: Reduce congenital syphilis
