### **Responses to PHEP BP5 Conditions of Award Due August 15**

PHEP recipients have until **Tuesday**, **August 15**, to submit their responses to any conditions associated with their Budget Period 5 (BP5) funding awards. Recipients should carefully review the terms and conditions of their notices of award (NoAs) to ensure they address all conditions of award (CoAs).

Recipients must respond to all weaknesses and required budget actions by submitting responses in the PERFORMS Program Management Module (PMM), and, if necessary, as grant notes in GrantSolutions by **August 15**. Recipients should direct questions about their NoAs and responding to CoAs to their PHEP project officers.

### APHL to Host August 15 Webinar on Malaria Diagnostics

The Association of Public Health Laboratories (APHL) will host a webinar entitled, "Get Up to Speed on Malaria Diagnostics: Are you Ready?" from **2 p.m. to 3 p.m. EDT on Tuesday, August 15**. This webinar will introduce malaria biology and diagnostic approaches including morphological, molecular, and rapid diagnostic test methods. ### August 17 COCA Call Highlights Measles Clinical Presentation, Diagnosis, and Prevention

NACCHO Releases RFA for Local Infectious Disease Outbreak Forecasting and Analytics Capabilities NACCHO, with support from CDC, announced a new funding opportunity, <u>Infectious Disease Outbreaks</u>: <u>Enhancing LHD Forecasting and Analytics Capabilities</u>. This RFA aims to strengthen local health departments' (LHDs) capacity to integrate forecasting and analytical tools into infectious disease outbreak planning and response at the local level. The project will involve implementing tools and methodologies to enable LHDs to proactively predict and analyze disease outbreaks. The goal of the project is to improve public health response and mitigate the impact of infectious diseases. Applications are due by **11:59 p.m. EDT on Friday, September 8**.

#### August is National Immunization Month

CDC data demonstrates that the <u>kindergarten vaccination rate</u> has steadily declined for all vaccines over the past two school years from 95% to 93% nationally, and by as much as 10% in certain jurisdictions. To support

getting school-aged children back on track with their routine immunizations, CDC is launched a new campaign as part of "Back to School Month."

The nationwide <u>Back-to-School Campaign</u> features digital ads that will run through September 2023. The digital ads aim to keep routine child vaccinations top of mind among parents of school-aged children. All <u>communication resources</u> are downloadable and available to disseminate directly through websites, offices, and social media channels. They are also available in both English and Spanish.

Providing evidence-based strategies and tools to support vaccination catch-up efforts. CDC resources can be accessed on the <u>Let's RISE</u> webpage. Additionally, the <u>Public Health Foundation</u> has developed a <u>new toolkit</u> with actionable resources for kindergarten vaccine coverage.

CDC's Public Health Law Program is now accepting host site applications for the <u>Public Health Law</u> <u>Fellowship</u>. CDC created this fellowship to strengthen the public health law workforce by increasing diversity within the field and preparing the next generation of public health law professionals to respond to critical issues. This program is open to state, tribal, local, or territorial health departments; CDC programs; or other public health law organizations that support work in the public health law and policy fields. This paid opportunity will provide graduate students, law students, and recent graduates of these programs with on-thejob training to prepare them for careers in public health law and policy.
