




Distribution of major rabies virus variants among mesocarnivores in the United States and Puerto Rico, 2008 to 2014.




Cases of rabies among wildlife in the United States, by year and species, 1983 to 2014

Reported cases of rabies in bats, by county, 2014








Reported cases of rabies in skunks, by county, 2014







Rabid Skunks

Reported cases of rabies in foxes, by county, 2014









Reported cases of rabies in cats, by county, 2014



Reported cases of rabies in dogs, by county, 2014




