	P = proportion of the year a woman is pregnant for each pregnancy outcome by month. Pb: 9 months = .75			
	Pa: 2 months = $.167$ Pd: 3 months = $.25$			
The calculation f	for pregnant women where all values are known is: WRA/1000 * { (B*Pb) + (A*Pa) + (D*Pd) }			

/1000 *	{(* 0.75) +	(* 0.167) +	(*0.25)}	=
