

REPRODUCTIVE HEALTH IN EMERGENCY PREPAREDNESS AND RESPONSE

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION: The web-based activity is designed to increase knowledge and change competency of emergency preparedness and response related to reproductive health, with special emphasis on the needs of pregnant and postpartum women, practices and strategies. Content is derived from actual literature, assessments of disaster-affected women of reproductive health, recommendations of public health and medical experts, and CDC resources to guide public health practice.

OBJECTIVES:

At the conclusion of the session, the participant will be able to:

- Recognize the effects of post-disaster events and selected infectious diseases on women of reproductive age (WRA), especially on pregnant and postpartum women.
- Describe post-disaster challenges in surveillance of WRA.
- Use assessments, clinical guidance and public health surveillance tools in emergency preparedness and response to WRA.
