The CDC Speakers Bureau has been in existence since August 1998. It evolved as a means to meet the public's request for first-hand real time information on hot topics and emerging public health issues.

Since its inception, the Speakers Bureau has received requests from stakeholders around the world, including:

- Schools, universities, community organizations, industry/corporations, and nonprofit organizations.
- The purpose of the CDC Speakers Bureau is to manage and provide assistance to identify speakers for events sponsored by CDC and outside organizations.



CDC employees from all disciplines volunteer their time to engage communities about the agency's public health impact.

- The topics span a multitude of health concerns including pandemic influenza, emergency preparedness, women's health, obesity, vaccines and immunizations and HIV/AIDS.
- The main focus of each presentation is to communicate information that the audience needs to protect their health – through health promotion, prevention of disease, injury and disability, and preparedness for new health threats.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

How do I request a speaker?

Simply go on line and complete the speaker request form.

How far in advance should I request a speaker?

All requests should be submitted at least 6-8 weeks prior to your event date.

Am I guaranteed to have a speaker for my event?

No. We make every attempt to fill all requests; however, Speakers Bureau participants are volunteers and may not be available for all events.

Do I have to pay a fee or honoraria for a speaker?

No. This is a free service.

Who is responsible for paying travel expenses?

It is customary for the host organization to pay travel expenses.
