

**Summary of Revisions**  
**in the**  
**National Electronic Telecommunications System for Surveillance (NETSS)**  
**RECORD LAYOUT FOR TRANSMISSION OF STD MORBIDITY DATA**  
**Effective as of January 2014**

All modifications to version 4 (January 2014) of the NETSS record layout for transmission of STD morbidity data are denoted by 'M' (M=Modified (2014)) in the column labeled "\*\*N/M".

Retirement of Event Codes

As of January 2014, several codes will be retired for the data element, EVENT or DIAGNOSIS. The retired codes are:

10276 = Granuloma inguinale (GI)

10306 = Lymphogranuloma venereum (LGV)

10307 = Nongonococcal urethritis (NGU)

10308 = Mucopurulent cervicitis (MPC)

10309 = Pelvic inflammatory disease (PID)

10315 = Syphilis, latent of unknown duration

10317 = Neurosyphilis

10318 = Syphilis, late with clinical manifestations other than neurosyphilis

[Note: Neurosyphilis can occur at almost any stage; therefore, it is not considered a stage itself. If there is neurological involvement that meets the "Neurosyphilis" case definition, send case notifications to NNDSS coded to the appropriate stage of syphilis and then code the neurological involvement variable to reflect either "Yes, confirmed" or "Yes, probable". In the STD NETSS STD record layout versions 2-4, use the "Neurological involvement" data element; while in version 1, use the variable "Neuro."]

Assignment of New Event Code

As of January 2014, a new event code has been assigned for the data element, EVENT or DIAGNOSIS. The code is:

10319 = Syphilis, late with clinical manifestations (including late benign syphilis and cardiovascular syphilis)
