# **Eliminating Syphilis** Philadelphia County, Pennsylvania

## Why is Syphilis Elimination in the U.S. within our reach now?

- Syphilis is a preventable and curable sexually transmitted disease (STD).
- Infectious syphilis is at the lowest rate ever reported: 2.6 cases/100,000 population (6,993 total cases).
- Syphilis is now very concentrated; half of all new cases in 1998 were reported from only 28 counties, which represent less than 1% of all U.S. counties.
- Other industrialized countries have already eliminated syphilis.

# Why is it Important to Eliminate Syphilis in Philadelphia County?

- In 1998 Philadelphia County ranked 15th in the nation in new cases of infectious syphilis (89 cases) and had a rate greater than 2 times the national rate.
- To reduce one of the most glaring racial disparities in health
  - S 88% of cases are among African Americans (79% of cases nationally).
  - S The infectious syphilis rate in Philadelphia County for African Americans is 13 times greater than the rate for white Americans.

#### To decrease spread of HIV infection

- S Syphilis increases HIV transmission at least 2-to-5 fold.
- S Syphilis in men who have sex with men increased 22% in Philadelphia County between 1997 and 1998.

#### To improve infant health

- S Syphilis can be transmitted from mother to fetus during pregnancy causing stillbirths or congenital persistent health problems.
- 1998 U.S.. rate: 2.6 cases/100,000 population infection, some of which may result in S In 1998, 21 cases of congenital syphilis were reported from Philadelphia County for a rate of 92.1 cases/100,000 births, greater than 4 times the national rate of 20.6 cases/100,000 births.
