


Using the History Timeline

Things to know before using the timeline

- The date shown at the top of the page indicates the year currently displayed.
- There are three options for navigating within the timeline.
 1. Select the dates displayed at the top right of the screen to move to a specific time in history.
 2. Select the Back and Next arrows, located on the right side of the screen, to move to a date on the timeline.
 3. Move to the beginning of the next century by selecting a date located at the bottom of the screen.
