
Convening CDC Partners as a Learning Community



The Learning Community is a \$9M (fiscal year 21-22) CDC collaboration effort that brings together 500+ organizations funded through the *Partnering for Vaccine Equity (P4VE)* program—from local community-based organizations to large medical associations and national foundations — to share knowledge and best practices to achieve vaccine equity.

P4VE Learning Community

Within the Learning Community, partners share their expertise, learn from other partners, and access resources, including best practices and ready-to-use communications products. Through group learning, one-on-one coaching with subject matter experts (SMEs), and data technical assistance, the Learning Community helps partners address urgent needs, share insights, and strengthen their capacity to address broader long-standing inequities in adult vaccination.



The Learning Community supports partners through cross-functional coordination including:

- Technical Assistance: one-on-one coaching and subject matter expertise to support program delivery
- Peer-to-Peer and Group Learning: workshops, webinars, and cohort-based insight sharing
- Resource Management: access to a curated and evaluated repository of materials and resources



Vaccine Resource Hub

P4VE partners and the public have access to a <u>Vaccine Resource Hub</u>, where they can search for and download vetted, culturally relevant materials to inform their work. P4VE partners are also able to share their own resources to be posted on the Hub. Resources include infographics, toolkits, videos, and more.
