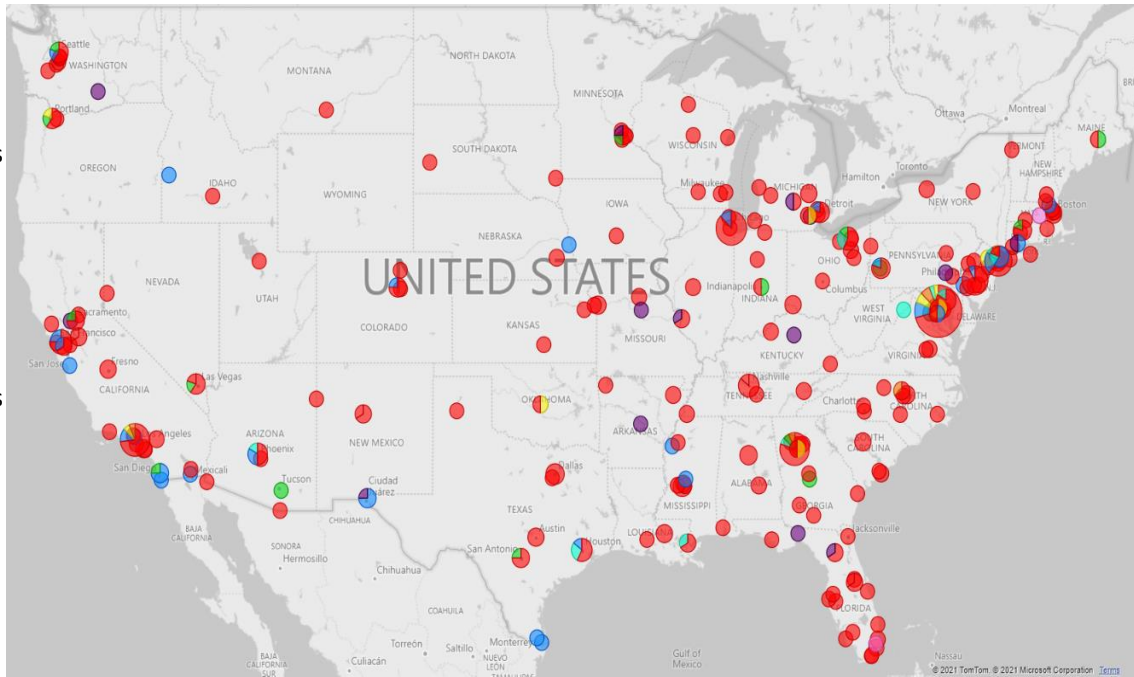


Partnering for Vaccine Equity: Program Partners
