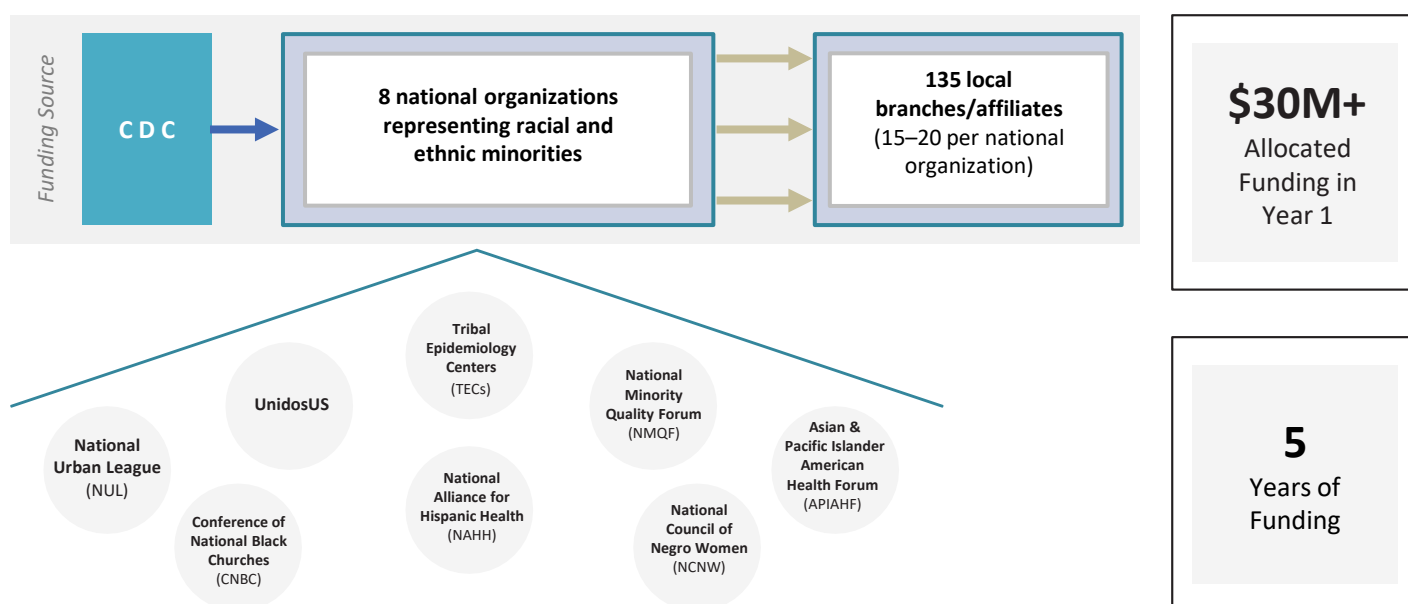


Partnering for Vaccine Equity with National Organizations

Engaging National Networks to Expand Immunization Equity

CDC’s Immunization Services Division (ISD) is committed to working with national partners addressing racial and ethnic disparities in immunization. National partners, in conjunction with their local chapters and offices, can scale best practices, quickly share lessons learned, and positively affect larger groups nationwide.

The *Partnering for Vaccine Equity* program activities engage various organizations that responded to CDC’s call for proposals. These organizations have longstanding ties to the priority populations for this program’s efforts to reduce vaccine disparities (African American, American Indian/Alaska Native, Asian American, Hispanic/Latino, Native Hawaiian/Pacific Islander).

Building Vaccination Infrastructure to Increase Community-Level Impact

As of February 2021, CDC provides support to eight national partners. These organizations implement vaccination activities, deploy educational campaigns, and equip influential messengers in 135 of their local chapters to engage communities experiencing immunization disparities.

Providing World-Class Data and Collaboration Tools to Improve Program Outcomes

CDC provides national partners access to data-based insights on population health and demographics, along with a repository of vaccine promotion and educational resources, to ensure effective activities. There will be opportunities for partners to learn from one another in workshops, webinars, and expert-guided technical assistance sessions.
