

Prevalence





More than 280,000 people report blindness or severe difficulty seeing even with glasses1.



Severe vision impairment is HIGHER in those reporting:

Poor Health 10% vs Good Health 2% Less than High School 5% VS High School and Above 2%2

Diabetes




Arthritis


