Rabies Control in the United States

Many systems work together to keep people safe from rabies. Each year, in the United States:

PREVENTION:



10 Million rabies vaccines are given to wild animals by wildlife biologists



Hundreds of scientists are working to develop new method to prevent rabies

IMPACT:



Less than 3 rabies deaths reported in the US

\$1 billion saved in healthcare cost



40 Million dogs and cats

are vaccinated against

rabies by animal health

experts

rabies deaths from their peak in 1945



130 specialized laboratories test **100,000** animals for rabies

>4,000 animals test positive for rabies – mostly bats, raccoons, skunks, foxes, cats, and dogs

DANGER:

The many facesof rabies control in the United States **60,000** Americans are thought to be exposed to rabies, and receive treatment

RESPONSE:

100,000 veterinarians, animal control staff, and public health workers assess rabies risk in animals and people
