



Survivor Eligibility

Are you eligible to enroll in the World Trade Center Health Program as a 9/11 Survivor?

If you lived, worked, or went to school or were in the New York City (NYC) Disaster Area in the days, weeks, or months after 9/11, you may be eligible for no-cost medical monitoring and treatment related to your 9/11 experience.

Almost 51,000 currently enrolled Survivors.

And are you sick?

Do you have symptoms or a condition that is covered by the Program that may be related to your 9/11 exposure? Some common symptoms are:

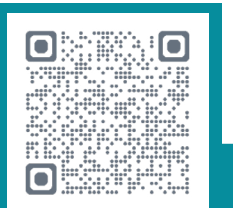
- Persistent cough or wheezing
- Chronic heartburn or acid reflux
- Constant runny or stuffy nose
- Trouble sleeping, anxiety, or depression
