

## Percentage\* of Women Aged 50–74 Years Who Had a Mammogram Within the Preceding 2 Years,† by Family Income§ — National Health Interview Survey, United States, 2021¶



**Abbreviation:** FPL = federal poverty level.

In 2021, 76.0% of women aged 50–74 years reported that they had a mammogram within the preceding 2 years. The percentage of women who had a mammogram within the preceding 2 years increased with family income, from 67.7% of women with family income <200% of FPL, to 74.3% of women with income 200% to <400% of FPL, and 81.5% of those with income  $\geq$ 400% of FPL.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>†</sup> Based on an affirmative response to the question, "Have you ever had a mammogram?" Those who answered "yes" were asked, "About how long has it been since your most recent mammogram?" This question was asked of all women, regardless of history of breast cancer.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>§</sup> As a percentage of FPL, which is based on family income and family size, using the U.S. Census Bureau's poverty thresholds. Family income was imputed when missing.
